Apprenticeship Program

The Apprenticeship program is a combined effort between Operating Engineers Local No. 9, the International Union of Operating Engineers, The Department of Labor, and our Signatory Contractors. The Apprenticeship is a three year program; during which time an Apprentice will be required to attend safety and trade related classes, to receive 144 hours per year of hands on training in heavy equipment skills such as, grade checking, heavy equipment mechanics, maintenance, and welding; and be employed in the trade by a signatory contractor.

Learn to Operate:

Cranes, Bulldozers, Backhoes, Graders, Scrapers, Trenchers, Loaders, Compactors, Pavers, Asphalts, Concrete Plants, Drilling and Boring Machines, Forklifts and Specialized Construction Machinery.



Learn to Read and Use Grade Stakes

Read: Grade Stakes, Slope Stakes, Right of Way Stakes, Station Markers and Blue Tops.

Use: Transit Hand Level, Engineers Rule, Laser.
